MUSIC NOTES: The art of organ improvisation has been a crucial aspect to the history of church music since the time of the Reformation. Organ improvisation were not only useful to teach new melodies to congregations in hymn introduction, but they were also used to highlight specific elements of the texts both while the congregation was singing along with the organ and when the organ was functioning alone as a solo instrument. Both the prelude and postlude today are pure improvisations. The music heard is not written down. After the familiar four part hymn *Nicaea* is heard in the Prelude, the following verset improvisations are inspired by some aspect of each verse of the hymn tune.
